
- 1. April 10, Wednesday Come meet the Grand Master of Masons in Texas at our lodge.

FROM THE SECRETARY'S DESK

I took on a six month contract to be the Security Director of a major industrial port. I'm also Secretary of the Lodge. And on top of that, each Tuesday (I had it placed in my Security Director contract to allow me



the day off) I volunteer at the schools assisting children with their reading skills -- and I am a published author of three novels with two more novels waiting to be finished. Sometimes there are just not enough hours in the day to do what I need to do, much less what I would like to do. So, whenever I hear someone talking about how they don't have time for this or that, I'm always interested, especially when they do not have a job which requires them to be on-call 24/7, they get off work sharply at 5 pm, and don't have to work on the weekends in order to keep up the workload

from their jobs.

When you are young and have children to raise, their school activities can eat up your free time. (Been there, done that!) If you are continuing your education by going to college at night after work, that will wear you down with the classes and their studies. (I remember those days!) You are working rotating shifts pulling twelve hours at a whack, then that will wreck your body as well as your mind. (Most of the time you don't know what day it is, much less have time with your family.) And there is always something that must be fixed around a house. (Murphy's Law: If it can break, it will, and at the wrong time.) But when you haven't been to lodge in so long that you can't



remember the last time you attended, at least be honest with yourself about why. I state this for a reason.

With the younger generation there is an addiction to social media. For some reason, which I've never fully understood, they feel compelled to place their every action on Twitter and Facebook. "I'm here at the Astros game with (name a person)..." "I'm out at the deer lease..." "I'm at (name the place) with (name a person)..." Then they post photos of everyone raising "adult beverages" into the air.

On one occasion we were discussing very important business at the lodge. A brother (who rarely came) wanted to provide input on the matter. I advised him to come to the lodge and hear all of the discussion. He immediately replied with a statement about how I didn't know everyone's personal situation and why they didn't come to lodge. It was a bit of a tirade, primarily arising from his guilt of not attending when he knew he could have. Why do I believe it was his guilt? Because he constantly placed his social activities on Facebook for the world to see, and he was definitely not restrained from coming to lodge by his Monday through Friday, 8 to 5 job.

The point to all of this is to be honest with yourself. If you can't be honest with yourself, then it's tough to be honest with others – especially a masonic brother.

We all need a break at times to help with "mental burnout"; a few simple hours to sit, relax, and basically 'veg' out. And we especially need quality time to spend with family or to partake in some form of personal enjoyment.

I think it's often too easy to over-schedule lodge events whereby you never have family free time (Every Monday nights is a degree or esoteric practice; Wednesday nights are meetings; Thursday nights are meetings or gatherings, and include fund-raising work or special weekend needs.)



The key to remember is that you wanted to become a Mason, and part of that obligation requires periodic attendance and being a part of the lodge. *Even if you only come to the stated meetings* (that's two nights in a month), that would be better than never coming at all.

Get out your twenty-four inch gauge, dust it off, and evaluate your time once more. Bring balance back into your life. Remember when you laid your hands upon the Holy Bible and willingly took the obligation? *I'm sure GOD remembers even if you have forgotten*.

We have new officers, Secretary, and Treasurer in office now. Pretty soon, there will be a new set of folks taking the lodge positions. And we have a lot of new members too. So, things are different from when you last came – and you can help make our lodge better by getting involved. Your voice in our lodge is important.

As Secretary, I'm not begging anyone to return to lodge. I'm just asking you to join us once again as our brother.
