






WELCOME HOME TO BROTHER BUDDY GLASS !!!

Bro. Glass was our Steward last year and was always present as a volunteer to help the lodge. He left to perform a year long security assignment in Afghanistan but now he's home with us. We are glad he's back!

At the September MWSA meeting, brothers running for the Grand Lodge South office came to meet and answer questions from all. This was an excellent opportunity to hear the views of Masons who one day may be our Grand Master of Texas. I was particularly impressed with a brother who spoke about his belief on "Masonry in Action." I wish it could have been recorded so everyone could hear it verbatim because of its importance.



In brief, the discussion was about lodge involvement with their communities, membership numbers being low, increasing lodge maintenance costs, brothers falling away and rarely coming to lodge, etc. The point upon which all this hinged was Masonry (in this case 'lodges') in action.

Lodges say they are community oriented, yet do little in order to be recognized by the community. After a while, the community knows there is a Masonic lodge in town but doesn't know much else about it. When lodges begin taking action to benefit their communities, they receive recognition and that translates into brothers wanting to be involved as well as to be recognized as a Mason! An example given was of a small lodge that conducted a fund-raising event for something other than the lodge. I believe it was to help a sick person with their medical bills in that community. The community loved it, talked about the lodge, suddenly brothers returned to lodge wanting to be a part of it AND membership dramatically increased. The lodge was recognized as being truly community oriented. How innovative!

The entire discussion, when viewed properly, showed how one thing related to another and culminated in positive benefits to the lodge and Masonry in general. Putting Masonry into action, actually doing something good for the community, is true Masonry...

Masonry is more than coming to eat a meal, say and do the same things in a meeting, *make no changes, make no decisions*, then rush out the door so you're not caught and have to do something. We, as Masons and members of our lodge, are individually responsible for how good our lodge is and how it's viewed by our community.

What if one day you received official notification that the lodge is closing its doors due to no one coming to lodge, rising financial expenses, and lack of member and community support?

I'm proud to say that this year we have a Worshipful Master who is addressing issues, trying to do what's right, making decisions, taking proper administrative actions, and has placed true community programs into action. He's receptive to new ideas and the key is that he's willing to try for the benefit of the lodge. We're not just selling briskets to pay bills and do one scholarship program. We are doing Time to Read, Fantastic Teeth, Gift-of-Life Blooddrive, Scholarships, as well as a car show and other fundraisers to pay bills. We also have more plans on the table. If you have a community oriented idea or any idea that will help the lodge, bring it to us.

Stagnation will kill our lodge. It will kill any group or organization. Sitting back on our laurels, doing only what has been done in the past and being afraid to make changes or decisions for the future only drives another nail in our coffin. Placing Masonry into action, actually doing something, breathes life into us...

The holidays are coming like a runaway freight train. Halloween is only a few weeks away. **Please bring a few bags of candy to the lodge** so we can give it away to the kids as we do every year. The lodge is also ramping up to **cook turkeys again for Thanksgiving** and we intend to make them better than last year. I'll send out more information in a few weeks.

There will be Christmas programs scheduled as well... Especially the Santa visit for the kids (and adults too.) The adults dog-pile onto Santa to have their pictures taken as well! (Secretarys' get to go first...)

The Golf Committee is working on plans for our **Annual Golf Tournament** to be held April 28, 2014 at the Alvin Country Club. So, all you Pros and Hackers need to make note on your calendars. (*Don't worry, it will be here before we realize.*) And we don't care how good a golfer you are... **The point is to come have fun!**

Sorry, folks, but we have to discuss another serious issue—the security and overall cleanliness of

our lodge. Our building is continuously used for meetings by the lodge masons and organizations such as OES, DeMolay, MWSA, and various special social functions. It speaks well of us to be such an active lodge and that it is a comfortable environment for activities.

We always ask everyone to please properly secure the building (turn off ovens, stoves, lights, fans, reset the A/C, lock all doors) when leaving, but we still find doors open, lights and fans on, etc.

Unfortunately, we also continue to discover attempts to break into
the rear door lock box. We've been lucky but one day our luck will run out and we are going to
find our lodge totally vandalized. When this occurs, it will cost thousands of dollars to repair
and get it back in order. We cannot afford such repairs. The lodge is already addressing high
monthly maintenance costs because of its volume of usage.



Our lodge kitchen and dining room is used by every group. Many a fantastic meal has been provided there for meetings! But just as at your own home, poor cleaning after a meal will attract bugs.

The lodge pays to have the building cleaned twice a month and we've been paying for years to have an exterminator spray every three months to control insects. The lodge stays clean until the next meeting and the extermination program definitely works because someone complained about having to sweep up dead bugs before meetings. Yes, that's because the spray program is working. It's

better to sweep them up before a meeting than to play "smack the bug" during a meeting.

Please help the lodge and every group that uses the lodge by cleaning after meetings, double-checking all the electrical systems, appliances and locking the doors when you leave the building.
